Lunchtime Legislative Briefing Session



MATHCOUNTS 2024

MATCHOUNTS competition was held in the Ashland and Canton areas of CRSPE on February 3 and February 10, 2024. Middle schoolers (grades 6-8) representing 9 schools participated in math skills utilizing timed sprint, target, team and countdown timed-testing methods. Awards were presented to the top team, individual and countdown round winners. The first-place team, and top 2 individuals not on the first-place team in Ashland and Canton, will advance to the State MATHCOUNTS competition in Columbus, Ohio on March 16, 2024.

The winning school with a team score of 46 was the Brecksville-Broadview Heights Middle School team, and consisted of students Luke Maher, Leland Fan, Vanshika Myneni, and Alex Bram. The top two individual competitors not on the winning team were Lleyton Bell from Brecksville-Broadview Heights, and Reese Goodman from Avon Lake Middle School. We had 6 schools compete in Ashland with a total of 54 competitors. The schools who competed at Ashland are as follows: Avon Lake Middle School, Learwood Middle School, Eastern Elementary, Lexington Junior High School, Green Middle School, and Brecksville-Broadview Heights Middle School. The competition held at Ashland University was facilitated by CRSPE's Ryan Athy.

The first-place team in the Canton area was North Canton Middle School. Team members were Ethan Huang, Ngoc Le, Hunter Davidson and Omar Awadallah; Ms. Brittney Sohar was North Canton's coach. The top 2 individuals from the Canton area were Shriraman P.rabhakaran (Jackson Middle School) and Zachary Jensen (Claymont Junior High School). Shriraman also won the Countdown Round. The Canton competition was held at the Aultman Hospital North Canton Medical facility and was facilitated by CRSPE's Tim Boron.

News Bytes - Intel Tours Stark State

Stark State will offer two career enhancement certificates in the fall in AI. Officials hope to expand their AI offerings and integrate the technology into other career paths such as manufacturing and health care. In 2022, Stark State was one of 15 community colleges nationwide — and the only Ohio college — awarded a \$40,000 grant to create an AI incubator.

Intel, Dell Technologies and the American Association of Community Colleges offered grants to community and technical colleges to make Al training accessible to novice learners. Intel, which is investing more than \$20 billion to build two computer chip factories in Licking County in Ohio, created the Al for Workforce program.

The Jackson Township-based college with satellite locations in Akron and Canton will offer two certificates in AI including an 18-credit certificate that can be completed in two semesters and a second nine-credit credential focusing on the fundamentals of AI that can be completed in a semester.
